Subject: -Grant of Conditional Permission to Mahila Utkarsh Pratishthan Ayurved College, Hospital & Research Centre, Pundlik Nagar Degaon Phata, Post. Linga K Tq. Risod Dist. Washim-444504 Maharashtra (Inst. Id. AYU0199) with 36 seats (Instead of 60 seats) in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24-regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

- Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Mahila Utkarsh Pratishthan Ayurved College, Hospital & Research Centre, Pundlik Nagar Degaon Phata, Post. Linga K Tq. Risod Dist. Washim-444504 Maharashtra (Inst. Id. AYU0199)** inspection of your College was conducted on **01.06.2023 & 02.06.2023 on Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and rating Board, NCISM to process **the Conditional Permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under Section 28 of NCISM ACT 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.**
- Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On examining the case in light of above notified and approved criteria and on perusal of the visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria due to the following shortcomings: -
 - Teaching Pharmacy** - Equipment status is Non-satisfactory.
 - Teaching Staffs: -**
 - Availability of total teaching staff for UG is** $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{21}{30} \times 100\% = 70.00\%$
(Excluding Excess and considering visitor observation report).

4. Functionality of the hospital -

a) There were 0 deliveries conducted from 1st Jan 2022 to 31st Dec 2022. Labour room is non-functional

5. Demonstration room is not available in herbal garden.

6. Observation by the visitors: -

- Reagents for microbiology, serology test was not available.
- Diet Chart was not found available in swasthviritta department.
- Few stocks register and attendance register of Prasuti tantra was not maintained.
- Transport Vehicle and ambulance were not shown during the visitation, it seemed to be those service is not available.
- Teaching pharmacy was not functional, no medicines were prepared since 2019 as told by the concerned teacher.
- Examination table of ENT OPD was not functional.
- X-Ray Machine was installed in X-ray room but it was not functional with no film developers in the dark room.
- There was no USG facility available in the college.
- Major OT was not functional.

7. Further, the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine is in receipt of a 02-complaint forwarded by Ministry of Ayush vide ref. no. L-11011/8/2023-EP-1 dated 10.07.2023 and detail of same is as under-

- The Asst. Charity Commissioner, Washim, canceled the registration of the said institution and transferred the said college to a company registered under the companies Act on 03.01.2023. (Copy enclosed)
- The hostel facilities are not being provided for boy and girls students.
- Hospital pathology is not functioning and pathological instruments, chemical, blood investigation facilities is only available on the time of visitation.
- Hospital RMO, EMO, CMO is not preset daily and appointed only on paper.

3. In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the 52nd Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 11.08.2023. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of even no. dated 22.08.2023 to appear on 25.08.2023 before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to why not the conditional permission to your college with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2023-24.

4. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide letter ref no. O/W MUPACHRC/273 dated 23.08.2023 against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, Dr. Vijay Shankarrao Jadhao, Principal, appeared before the Hearing Committee on 25.08.2023 and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The

shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under: -

8. Shalyatantra: Dr. NandkishorRanjave promoted as Associate Professor by institute but onNCISM portal it not updated as associate professor from ncism.
9. Panchakarma: Dr. Pravin Tambe Associate Professor is available, joining and appointment is attached

6. Principal submitted that Dr. Hemant Narwade has been promoted as Associate Professor on 03/10/2022, but his designation is not updated on OTMS portal. After verification in part-1 it is observed that his designation was mentioned as assistant professor and he is promoted after submission of part-1. After verification in OTMS it is found that the teacher is promoted early and not completed 5 years of teaching experience so cannot be considered.
Shortcoming persists
7. Principal submitted that Dr. Amol Narwade has promoted as Associate Professor on 03/08/2022, but his designation is not updated on OTMS portal. After verification in part-1 it is observed that his designation was mentioned as assistant professor but promotion request is approved by the NCISM so can be considered as an associate professor, **but after promotion shortcoming of LF exist.**
Shortcoming persists
8. Principal submitted that Dr. Nandkishore was promoted on 04/12/2022 and after promotion his OTMS profile is not updated. He also informed to the committee that in part-1 his designation was mentioned as lecture. But, his promotion order **is updated in the OTMS so can be considered.**
9. Principal submitted that Dr. Pravin Tambe is joined as Associate Professor in the department of panchakarma on 21/04/2023i.eafter the submission part-1 but the provided teacher code is not correct so cannot be verified.
Submission not considered Shortcoming persists

Principal submitted that Dr. Mitesh Kumar Gujarathi was joined as DMS on 02/05/2023i.e after the submission of part-1, hence can't be considered.

iii. **EMO:**
Principal submitted that Dr. AjitEkhande was joined as EMO in the hospital.
After verification of part-1 by the committee, it is observed that his name was not mentioned in part-1, hence he can't be considered as EMO.

iv. **Matron:** Principal submitted that Mrs. Sanjana More was appointed as Matron and her joining is 01/05/2023.
Committee is in the view that the joining of the Matron is after submission of part-1 and hence she can't be considered.

v. **House Officer;**
Principal accepted the Shortcoming of one house officer in the hospital.

vi. **PanchkarmaAssistant:**Principal submitted that the hospital has joined Mr. Yogesh junghare on 05/06/2023 i.e after the submission of part-1 and hence accepted the Shortcoming of one PK assistant in the hospital.

vii. **Yoga Teacher;**
Principal has submitted that Mr. Suresh Pundalik Gaikwad has already working with the college as Yoga teacher since 01/04/2021. He was present during visitation and visitors from NCISM were verified him during visitation.

Committee asked to submit all relevant evidences for his presence on the day of visitation. On scrutiny of part-2 it is observed that Mr. Suresh Gaikwad was on special duty on the day visitation however his edibility was verified by visitors.

Hence Mr. Suresh Pundalik Gaikwad may be considered as yoga teacher.

Principal accepted the joining of Sh. Rahul More as OT nurse is after the submission of part-1. And hence shortcoming persists.

The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, **and once again as per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM)**, the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the **57th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) **held on 05.09.2023.**
6. WHEREAS, in view of the shortcoming and deficiencies mentioned in above paras, and as per the observation of Hearing Committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report has been carefully examined in terms of concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and it is found that the college was not fulfilling the **basic eligibility criteria as mentioned in the hearing letter for issuance of conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020. However, Board decided to issue conditional permission as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2023-24.**

For deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 10 % of total intake capacity."

Accordingly as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016 the deficiency of teacher for up to sixty intake capacity shall not exceed more than ten percent of total requirement. As per the Hearing Committee observation and approval of Minutes in the 57th Board meeting of MARBISM, college is having only 23 total eligible Teaching faculties.

*There is deficiency of 04 teachers for issuance of conditional permission for academic session 2023-24 as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016. **Therefore, in accordance of Reduction policy 2023-2024, for deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 10% of total intake capacity.***

*Accordingly, after applying the seat reduction policy 2023-24 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of **conditional permission with 36 seats (Instead of 60 seats)** under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24.*

7. Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above and after applying the seat reduction policy, **Conditional Permission is granted to Mahila Utkarsh Pratishthan Ayurved College, Hospital & Research Centre, Pundlik Nagar Degaon Phata, Post. Linga K Tq. Risod Dist. Washim, Maharashtra (Inst. Id. AYU0199) with 36 seats (Instead of 60 seats) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations there under for the academic session 2023-24 subject to the following condition-**
- I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the colleges/hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant rules and regulations.
 - II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity **with 36 seats (Instead of 60 seats)** shall be treated as All India Quota. The counseling for seats under All India Quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned counseling authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for All India Quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
 - III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no.BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per

the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.

8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
9. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
10. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
11. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2023 and send a compliance report to get permission for the academic session 2024-25:**
 - (i) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - (ii) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
 - (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto;
12. The fulfillment of the conditions given above along with the shortcoming mentioned in hearing Committee observation report may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2024-25.
